Volunteering With Literacy NRV

Family READS

Helping parents learn skills to read with children and help children succeed in school

- Dinner is provided and we eat together as a group
- Children are taken to a separate area to do crafts, read books, etc.
- Parents are put in groups with volunteers and go over skills to help their children with school work
- We end by everyone playing a game together





English for Life

Leveled English classes for beginning level students to advanced intermediate students. The class focuses on reading, writing, speaking and listening to English.

- Curriculum-based class focusing on vocabulary and grammar
- Students learn in groups based on their assessed levels and work together to practice reading, writing and improving conversation skills based on that topic.





1-to-1 Tutoring

Work with adult learners one-to-one to help with improving their skills:

- English listening, speaking, writing, and reading
- Basic computer skills
- GED preparation
